# Parent's Role in Learning

She spent every afternoon dancing through the house, her red curls bouncing with every leap; twirling and sliding in dramatic fashion in stocking feet across the kitchen floor. She loved to dance; and yet when I asked my youngest if she wanted to go to dance class, she looked horrified and answered with an emphatic, "NO!" When I asked her why, she was just as emphatic, "I can't go to dance class because I don't know how to dance!"

I think of my daughter's answer when I am talking to parents about their child's transition to kindergarten. Often there is concern that their child hasn't "learned enough" to move on to kindergarten. Parents know that kindergarten is more focused on academics these days. They are concerned that their child hasn't "learned enough" of the academic skills to move on to the place that is responsible to "teach" academic skills. *(Sounds to me like the* "can't go to dance class because I can't dance "logic.)

I remind parents that you can't start building a house until you have built a sound foundation. The role of a developmentally appropriate early childhood program is to nurture the foundational skills that allow a child to access the next level of learning that begins in kindergarten.

Your child's preschool teacher knows that meaningful learning involves encouraging development of the "whole child". It is not just about the brain. It is not just about what your child KNOWS; it is about who your child IS as a learner.

The different areas of development are interrelated and impact a child's ability to handle the academic demands of kindergarten. Social/emotional development impacts learning. Language development impacts learning. Physical development impacts learning; and so on. We nurture a strong foundation when we encourage all areas of development.

Just as the focus of early childhood education is different from kindergarten;

the roles of parent and preschool teacher are different, but of equal importance.

Parents have opportunities to take advantage of "teachable moments" during the course of everyday routines and interactions. You influence your child's learning in ways that teachers cannot. It does not cost money, or require special materials, just an awareness of how to take advantage of daily opportunities. CT **ELDS Action Guides online** give a list of suggestions to parents as to how they can support their child's learning and development..

Parents are invited to find out how the body impacts learning next Wed., Feb. 4 (9:15-10:15 am) at our parent workshop, "TOTAL **BODY ACTIVATION FOR** LEARNING". (See flyer for information on how to register for this free developmental workshop.)

Parents have a unique role in helping their child develop a strong foundation for learning. Little interactions NOW have a BIG impact long term.

### PLEASE REMEMBER TO LABEL **EVERYTHING!!!**

Please send shoes for your child to change into when they are inside. Boots are hot and often cause tripping when worn in the classroom. (Sneakers on Wed. for gym.)
